Investigations of Anomalies

Investigation results into the anomalies are still expected to be received by HCC by the end of February.

Temporary Access Road

Repairs to the road have been completed this week and the orange plastic fence has been straightened to make the area slightly tidier. As requested, the red and white tape by the temporary road was removed last week.

Utilities

National Grid have now been on site to clear up and we continue to remain in contact with the other utility companies.

Site

HCC contractors have attended site to do a litter pick around the Heath picking up surplus bits of equipment including some of the plastic road plates that were in the mud and the pins used to fix them down, as well as some bags of salt and general rubbish. The large bags of sand close to the boundary with the school will require a machine to move them and we hope to have this resolved by the end of the month.
