## **Traveller Incursion**

As yet the Council has made no decision about installing barriers along Sandridge Road following the traveller incursion of July 2019. Suggestions are for wooden or concrete bollards, or a ditch and mound: the committee feels that a ditch and mound could be breached with boards too easily and that too much of the Heath itself would be lost. We understand that the Council wants to consider its green spaces in the round to ensure some uniformity of approach and to ensure that no one vulnerable site is left unprotected. Our local councillors are supportive of groups such as the Friends and residents being engaged in selecting the best solution for the Heath so that it is not subject to any more such incursions in future.
