Beech Bottom Dyke and Heath paths

The Dyke bottom path has become very muddy and part-blocked by logs after felling of unsafe trees. It has been suggested that a special Action Day could be held (for fitter members), to move the logs aside to make the way passable. Parts of the main paths on the Heath have been improved. The test will be how they stand up to winter weather.

However, we are preparing to plant two donated sizeable oaks in the New year; additionally, we shall be collecting five very small native trees donated by Herts County Council, which will be planted over the winter.
